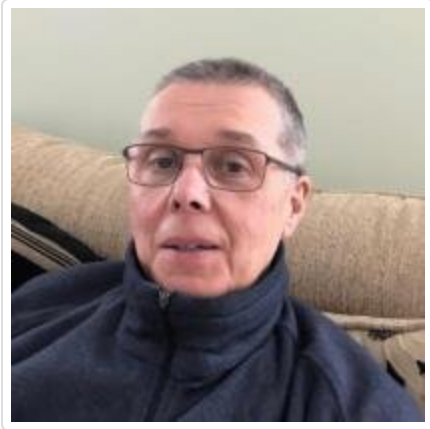




Stanley R. Padykula

Stanley R. Padykula Jr. passed away on March 6, 2024 after a few years battling ALS, also known as Lou Geurig disease. He was affectionately known as Stan, and for those closest to him as Stachu.
